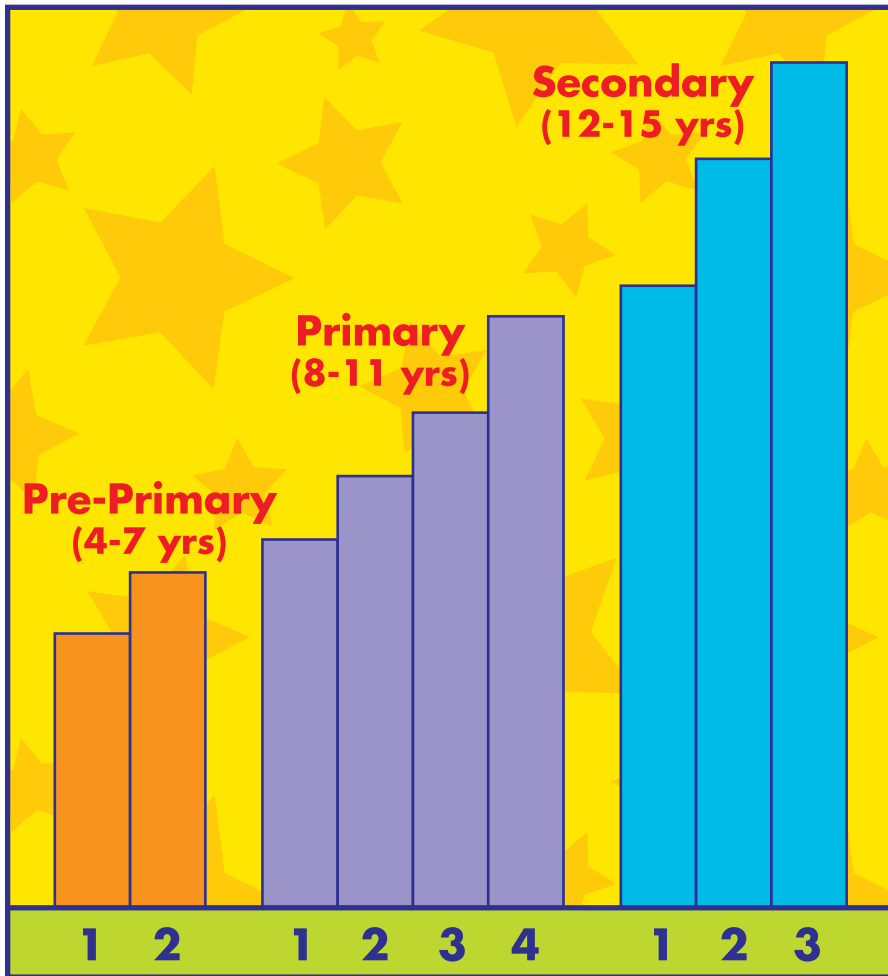




Proficiency Levels



Pre-Primary

Level 1: Exposed to sounds and rhythms of target language. Learns basic vocabulary related to themselves and their immediate surroundings. Understands and produces short phrases.

Level 2: Deepens vocabulary base and active speaking skills. Able to use key phrases and question words with prompting.

Primary

Level 1: Can use target language for very basic communication needs. Can speak target language clearly with a few serious pronunciation mistakes.

Level 2: Can use target language to hold short age-appropriate conversations and deal with concrete practical situations. Pronunciation is very good with correct intonation.

Level 3: Can conduct short conversations with confidence, correct pronunciation and intonation. Can produce complex sentences and articulate basic needs, ideas and desires without contextual cueing.

Level 4: Can communicate in the target language for most daily situations. Has near-native pronunciation and intonation.

Secondary

Level 1: Can understand and use short phrases as they pertain to common age-appropriate everyday situations. Can get by in a foreign country with assistance.

Level 2: Can cope with a diverse range of everyday situations in the target language. Can understand authentic native speakers in real-life conditions and express themselves fluently with reasonable accuracy.

Level 3: Can express themselves freely in an age-appropriate situation. Can effectively argue a position and understand and express opinions, attitudes, moods, wishes as well as concrete facts with a high degree of both fluency and accuracy.
